# 概要


- ●再生可能エネルギー特別措置法施行規則の一部を改正する省令と関連告示 (2015年1月22日公布)による遠隔出力制御に対応しています。
- ●電力会社からインターネットを介して出力制御の情報を取得し、これに従い パワーコンディショナを制御します。
- ●今後正式に発表される遠隔出力制御の仕様によっては、出力制御ユニットのファームウェア (ソフトウェア) の更新が必要となる場合もあります。
- ●遠隔出力制御は電力会社の要請により実施されますので、詳細については 電力会社にご確認ください。



# ご使用時の注意点

## ご使用前に必ずお読みください

- ①建物の構造 (RC、鉄骨、断熱材のアルミシートなど) 等の影響でセンサーユニットや表示ユニット間の 電波状態が悪くなる場合があります。出力制御ユニットを屋根裏等に隠蔽設置しないでください。
- ②出力制御ユニットから表示ユニット、センサーユニットへの通信距離の目安は、障害物がない場所での 見通し距離で50mです。
- ③出力制御ユニットの電源は常時入れておいてください。電源が切れるとパワーコンディショナは発電を 止めます。
- ④インターネットに接続してご使用の場合は、LANケーブルを抜いたりルータ等ネットワーク機器の電源を切ったりしないで常時接続にしてください。

## 出力制御について

- ①以下の場合は発電が停止しますのでご注意ください。
  - ・出力制御ユニットの電源が切れた場合。
  - ・出力制御ユニットとセンサーユニット間の通信(有線または無線)が途切れた場合。
- ②出力制御ユニットはインターネットに接続して電力会社のサーバから最新の出力制御スケジュール情報を取って制御を行ないます。ルータ等ネットワーク機器の電源が切れたり接続ケーブルが抜けたりしてインターネットに接続できないと最新のスケジュール情報が取得できず、発電量が減るおそれがあります。

# 無線通信について

本製品はセンサーユニット及び表示ユニットと、**特定小電力無線を使用**して通信を行なっているため、次のような場合は注意が必要です。

- ①特定小電力無線は電波法による免許不要の無線であり、自動車用エンジンスターター等にも使用されています。
  - これらが本製品の近くにある場合、両者の無線通信が干渉し、表示ユニットの表示が頻繁におかしくなる(アンテナマークが「圏外」、表示数値が「O」、または自動車用エンジンスターターが動作しない等)の現象がおこる可能性があります。(表示については表示ユニットの取扱説明書をご覧ください)これらの現象がおきた場合は、速やかにお買い上げの販売店にご連絡をいただき、無線通信の干渉を防ぐ処置(例えば、周波数の変更など)についてご相談ください。
- ②太陽光発電システムの機器や配線から電気的雑音が漏れ、近隣のアマチュア無線やラジオなどの通信・ 受信の障害になることがあります。近隣にアマチュア無線のアンテナがある場合は、お買い上げの販売店 にご相談ください。


# 設置のしかた

本体(出力制御ユニット)は固定台へ取り付けて水平な所に置くか、壁に固定してご使用ください。


1 固定台を本体底面に合わせる

3 水平な所に置いて使用する

●水平な凹凸のない所 (テーブルなど) に置いてご使用ください。


## 壁固定のしかた

### 固定台を付属の木ネジで 壁に固定する


- ●木ネジで確実に固定できる十分な強度のある壁面に設置してください。




1 イーサネットケーブルを LAN端子に接続する

2 ACアダプタを接続する

●ACアダプタを接続し、コンセントに差し込む と全てのLEDランプが約30秒間点灯します (起動準備中)。電源は入れたままにしてくだ さい。4分以上電源が切れた状態が続くと発 電が止まってしまうのでご注意ください。 その場合は電源を再投入することにより発電 が再開されます。











モジュラーケーブルを センサーユニット接続端子に 接続する







Also, for each author's protection and ours, we want to make certain that everyone understands that there is no warranty for this free software. If the software is modified by someone else and passed on, we want its recipients to know that what they have is not the original, so that any problems introduced by others will not reflect on the original authors' reputations.

Finally, any free program is threatened constantly by software patents. We wish to avoid the danger that redistributors of a free program will individually obtain patent licenses, in effect making the program proprietary. To prevent this, we have made it clear that any patent must be licensed for everyone's free use or not licensed at all.

The precise terms and conditions for copying, distribution and modification follow.

#### **Preamble**

The licenses for most software are designed to take away your freedom to share and change it. By contrast, the GNU General Public Licenses are intended to guarantee your freedom to share and change free software—to make sure the software is free for all its users.

This license, the Lesser General Public License, applies to some specially designated software packages—typically libraries—of the Free Software Foundation and other authors who decide to use it. You can use it too, but we suggest you first think carefully about whether this license or the ordinary General Public License is the better strategy to use in any particular case, based on the explanations below.

When we speak of free software, we are referring to freedom of use, not price. Our General Public Licenses are designed to make sure that you have the freedom to distribute copies of free software (and charge for this service if you wish); that you receive source code or can get it if you want it; that you can change the software and use pieces of it in new free programs; and that you are informed that you can do these things.
